



## Farewell with Gratitude

As I approach the completion of my internship, I want to express my gratitude for your kindness, support, encouragement, feedback, and prayers throughout this year. I found myself stretched to my limit several times as I worked at Prairiewoods, completed seminary classes, and honored the relationship with you here at Faith, but I always came away from my experiences in the parish with a sense of renewed energy and focus. I also want to share several prayers I have known since high school that helped sustain me through this discernment time, in the hopes you will share them with your children and grandchildren as they make their way through life:

The first is from a significant anthropologist from the middle of the last century who was theologizing about evolution when it was still not well accepted by the church, Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, SJ, “Above all, trust in the slow work of God. We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay. We should like to skip the intermediate stages. We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new. And yet it is the law of all progress that it is made by passing through some stages of instability – and that it may take a very long time. And so I think it is with you; your ideas mature gradually—let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste. Don’t try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will) will make of you tomorrow. Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be. Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete.”

The second is from poet Rainer Marie Rilke, “Be patient toward all that is unsolved in your heart and try to love the questions themselves ...Do not now seek the answers, which cannot be given you because you would not be able to live them. And the point is, to live everything. Live the questions now. Perhaps you will then gradually, without noticing it, live along some distant day into the answer.”

Finally, one from the monk, Thomas Merton, “My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.”



## Faith Farm Update

Hi Faith Farmers !It's time for us to touch base regarding the progress of our cherry tomatoes. I met with Rick Y. yesterday to put our heads together and come up with a plan since harvest will be upon us in a few weeks. Here are some notes, all simply for your reference and reflection.

**Condition of Plants** The plants are generally looking good. When looking at Faith Farm as a whole, it's clear that the outer-most rows have suffered some damage from the deer. Despite that, many of those nibbled-on plants still have a few flowers and small tomatoes on them. Harvest might be light on those rows, but we'll take what we can get since we anticipated deer activity on the farm. Overall, there are not as many flowers as I would like to see on all of the plants, which might be concerning...or it might be too early to tell. There are several rows, especially in the middle of the farm, that are looking great! Rick and I enjoyed a couple nearly-ripe tomatoes last night and are confident that they will be relatively plentiful.

**Weaving** At your convenience, please weave one or two more times (if you have the space) as the tomatoes are starting to grow thanks to the heat. I'm sure you've all discovered that it's easier to weave the plants when the twine is already up. However, our "Marion-Round-About" method that Barbara explained works very well :) Rick placed an extra box of twine in the black plastic bag by the garage. Weave at will, farmers!

**Harvest** I would guess - and this is just a guess - that we will be harvesting some rows in a week or two. Other rows might take until the beginning of August. Here's where we need your judgement: Check in on your row every few days or so. When you see your tomatoes are ready to pick, go for it! Rick is going to get some boxes from Sonia since he sees her every Thursday and will place them somewhere that we can all access them as needed. The tricky part will be getting the tomatoes to Sonia after they are picked. Any suggestions on this?

**Your Next Steps** To recap: 1. Weave your row one or two more times, if applicable. 2. Keep an eye on your row to determine when you need to harvest. 3. Continue your positive attitudes! 4. Contact any of the Faith Farm leaders with your questions (me, Christy, Barb, Susan) or Rick for logistical/materials type questions.


